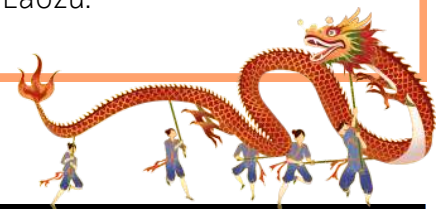
LUNAR NEW YEAR

Also known as the Spring Festival, marks the beginning of a new year on the traditional lunisolar calendar. It is one of the most important holidays in Asian culture and was placed on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity list in 2024. Marking the end of winter and the beginning of spring, this festival takes place from Lunar New Year's Eve to the Lantern Festival, held on the 15th day of the year.

Lunar New Year is crucial for its emphasis on family reunion, honoring ancestors, welcoming prosperity, and marking a fresh start, reinforcing core cultural values like filial piety and community, while also having significant economic and social impact globally through traditions like the reunion dinner, red envelopes, and cleaning to sweep away bad luck.

LUNAR LEGEND

According to legend, Lunar New Year began with a battle against a mythical beast called the Nian. The Nian, a lion-like creature with horns, would come from the sea or mountains each year during the Spring Festival and attack villagers, especially children. One year, as the villagers hid, an old man stayed behind. He decorated homes with red paper and set off firecrackers. The next day, the village was unharmed. The people realized the Nian was afraid of the color red and loud noises. From then on, families celebrated the New Year by wearing red clothes, hanging red lanterns and scrolls, and lighting firecrackers to scare away evil spirits. According to the legend, the Nian never returned and was eventually captured by the Taoist monk Hongjun Laozu.
