- 4) If you are a kindergarten parent or need to drop your child off at their classroom door, **please park in our visitor lot** or near the school and walk. (the visitor lot is the first lot on the left as you enter our parking lot)
- 5. ALWAYS keep your vehicle speed at a very LOW speed in our entire parking loop.
