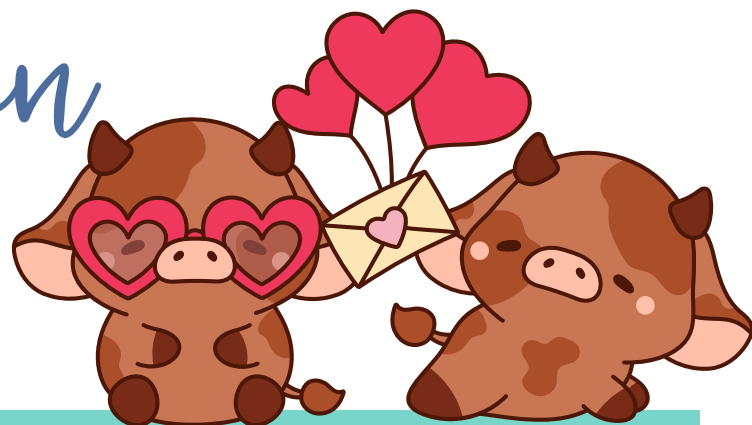

EXCITING NEWS

The Playground Committee continues to make strong progress toward our goal of expanding and upgrading our playground. In addition to ongoing fundraising efforts, the committee has been actively coordinating with our school community and the School District, and developing proposals to help bring this project to life.

At our most recent PAC meeting, PAC approved an additional \$8,300 contribution to the playground fund. We are now approximately \$15,000 away from reaching our fundraising target. We are very grateful to our sponsors and to our school community for the continued support.

The School District has confirmed that our school is currently in the queue for a summer playground installation, pending final selection of the playground design. We will be sharing proposal details and holding a vote at the upcoming PAC meeting.

Please join us at the next PAC meeting on February 19 for updates and to participate in the vote.

Project Timeline:

- Fundraising Deadline: May 1, 2026
- Target Installation Window: August 2026
